- (2) Late French Immersion (LFI) enrollment: 24 students;
- (3) Efforts ongoing to increase numbers. Suggested Action Items: Banner at intersection 27th and Seaton, Maven Lane mailout, Castanet article, early learning fair, Beairsto float in the parade

- c) DPAC report Natalie Ellard

- i) **DPAC Budget** \$18,000 in budget and they have \$16,000 left
- Community Event: DPAC is planning a gathering for PAC members, with each able to invite their DPAC Rep and two additional members. The event will celebrate the outgoing President and include an educational component and speaker sessions. No similar session has been held since 2019 Potential event topics:

- iii) VP/Principal Pool: 4 Candidates (2 internal, 2 external) available for vacancies. Language needs may affect Beairsto's eligibility
- iv) PAC insurance: PACs are covered under District insurance for sanctioned events (Principal approved). Events with alcohol require separate PAC insurance.
- v) Trustee Update: Budget consultations are underway
- vi) International Exchange program: One of BC's largest programs. Expanding with \$400K funding, 6% budget increase and 375 students from 18 countries.
- vii) Public attendance at Board meetings: restricted due to past safety concerns special permission required through DPAC
- viii) Increasing noon hour supervisors
- ix) Bill 40 Indigenous Education Councils (IECs)
 - (1) Mandated IECs to enhance Indigenous student outcomes
 - (2) Councils will advise on achievement strategies, funding and policy
 - (3) Collaboration underway with the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC)
- x) Sanctuary Schools Policy
 - (1) Ensures all school-aged children, regardless of immigration status have access to education
 - (2) Ensures that all school-aged children ordinarily resident in the district can attend school,

(3) No barriers to education should exist for students due to lack of documents

- e) Dionne Hot lunch & Treasurer Report
 - i) Hot lunch -

- ii) Treasurer's report -
 - (1) Fundraised \$12,500 to date
 - (2) \$6000 committed to projects so far
 - (3) Approx another \$6000 to spend
 - (4) We have a request for outdoor equipment (\$5000)(a) Shade sails in the back
 - (b) Features around the school for balance, etc
 - (5) There are grants that we can apply for
 - (a) Action Item: Canadian Dermatology Association anything that promotes shade to help reduce skin cancer
 - (b) Many other playground equipment grants with varying deadlines for application

- (6) We have a request for new school T-shirts for this year and incoming Kindergarteners (\$1,920)
- (7) We have a request for support for Grade 7 trips. In previous years we have given \$1,200.
- (8) Current bank account balance \$22,403.79 (doesn't include the outstanding invoices to Silverstar brewing, Shuswap Pies, or Boston Pizza).
- iii) Gaming account approx \$2,400 left that hasn't been earmarked for activities underway

We have requests for:

- (e) Chess club request Hoping to use the monies from the Beairsto christmas spending night for this
- (f) Referees for the Gr. 7 3-on-3 looking at whether highschool kids could get their Careers volunteer hours this way
- (g) Allan Brooks field trip for Kindergarten and the Cardiff Miller trip for the Grade 6s.

5) PAC Funding Requests: Discussion & Vote

- a) We propose \$5000 to go towards Outdoor Equipment from the General Account, which can be considered for carrying over should the next executive agree.
- b) We propose \$1,500 to go toward the Grade 7 trips from the General Account
- c) We propose \$ 1,920 for school shirts for Kindergarteners from the General Account. Action Item: Fall fair idea spirit wear swap, bring in your outgrown Beairsto gear.
- d) Mandy proposes a vote for \$5000 to Outdoor Equipment, \$1,500 to Gr. 7 trips and \$1,920 to school shirts from the General Account; all in favour
- e) We propose \$1,500 to go into a hardship fund for field trips, \$115 for the Rugby club, \$150 for the Indigenous outdoor workshop bussing, \$240 for the Osmo club from the Gaming Account. Mandy proposes a vote, all are in favour.
